What We Need

Theologian and author Peter Leithart puts it this way:

"At twilight on the first Easter, two disciples of Jesus were traveling on the road toward the town of Emmaus. They had fled Jerusalem to escape the Jews. They talked in disappointed tones about the strange things they had heard and seen. Suddenly, Jesus joined them and asked what they were talking about.

"So they told Jesus His life story...how He was a prophet mighty in deed and in the sight of God, a new Moses; how they hoped He would redeem Israel; how He had been

seized and executed. They even told Jesus the story of the resurrection. They knew the entire gospel story, but they were still too dejected and frightened for mission. They knew the whole gospel story, but they didn't recognize Jesus.

"So Jesus started telling Bible stories, from Genesis through all the Prophets and Psalms. All the way through, He taught them that everything in the Scriptures was about His suffering and glory. But the word alone wasn't enough. Even Jesus' inexplicable presence wasn't enough. They recognized Jesus only when He broke bread. Then, like Adam and Eve, their eyes were opened and they saw Jesus.

"At that moment, everything changed. They had been fleeing Jerusalem, but now they return. They had left the other disciples, but now they rejoin them. They had been perplexed about the resurrection, but now they become witnesses to it."

And what's the point for us?

If we want to join the mission of the Risen Jesus, we need the whole Bible burning in our hearts. And we need the broken bread...the fruit of God's garden tree that opens our eyes to see the stunning good news of the risen Jesus among us. We need the strength that comes to us from regular Bible study and weekly worship...the things that form our lives around that which we confess to be life-giving: the presence of the living Lord who richly endows us with blessing so that we can go into the world to bless others. And while it is true that God works in and through all circumstances, our particular call as the Body of Christ is not to ignore what we know is salutary, but to embrace it...to respond to Christ's risen presence among us in ways that form us (as individuals and as a congregation) for mission.

In these days after Easter...as the weather warms and summer schedules beckon...please don't forget that we still need to be fed for the work we share. What we need is here as we gather, worship, study, and go to serve together. Make sure that you are here, too. †

allowed to speak. Once the stick is returned to the center of the circle, others may take it to share their stories.

In addition, Warriors Journey Home has agreements which are used to create safety in the circle. Some of the agreements include: to tell the truth; to not use language to harm; to not be under the influence of drugs or alcohol; to not interrupt when someone else is speaking; and to actively listen with an open heart.

Those who come to Warriors' Journey Home realize that when they share their stories with others, they're letting go of their personal pain. "War wounds souls," and Warriors' Journey Home allows their wounds to bleed in order for cleansing and healing, and it's the warrior's responsibility to make this happen. In addition to 'war wounds,' sometimes veterans feel guilty for leaving their families and anxiety over making their families live the military lifestyle. Warriors' Journey Home helps to provide comfort and healing and has helped some avoid drugs, alcohol and even suicide.

Warriors' Journey Home is open to all veterans, families of veterans and anyone whose life has been touched by a veteran. It is a privilege for Holy Trinity to be a site for such an important outreach ministry for those who are hurting. †

The mission of Warriors' Journey Home is to provide spiritual healing and soul repair for veterans, families and the community. It was founded by Pastor John Schluep with First Congregational Church in Tallmadge. Holy Trinity Lutheran Church has served as a location site for Warriors' Journey Home for the past three years. The group meets the 2nd and 4th Sunday at 3 p.m.

Warriors' Journey Home is a gathering place where participants come 'to listen ... to speak ... and to heal.' Those that come to a Sunday meeting sit in a circle surrounding the talking stick. The individual holding the talking stick is the only one





What a Holy Week!

It began with Palm Sunday where everyone gathered on the front steps to bless the palms, hear the Gospel account of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and processed in the sanctuary. Next came the Paschal Triduum with Maundy Thursday that included foot-washing to recall Jesus' act of self-giving service. And the chancel was stripped of its decoration as Jesus was humiliated by his captors. This was followed by Good Friday that included a reading of the Passion according to St. John, Solemn Prayers and the Adoration of the Cross. Easter Vigil concluded the Paschal Triduum and began with a gathering outside around a new fire. The Paschal Candle, extinguished after Thursday's service, was lit and the good news of Easter (the Light of Christ!) was proclaimed. Everyone processed inside for a series of readings and responses from the Old Testament following by a gathering around the baptismal font for Affirmation of Baptism. The service then moved into the Sanctuary where the Easter Gospel was read and the first Eucharist of Easter was celebrated. †

A Look at the Numbers

It is a privilege to worship, to serve, and to give of ourselves as we share God's Good News with our neighbors and friends. We do that as individuals by the choices we make in everyday life. And we do that together by our work as a congregation. That's what good stewardship is all about.

For that reason, we monitor statistics on attendance and giving to the church. They offer a glimpse into the health of our congregation. Through the first fifteen weeks of the year, average weekly worship attendance at Holy Trinity (Sunday morning and midweek services) was 206. That's up from an average of 192 per week during the same period last year...an increase of 7.3%. Worship is fundamental to the strength of the community and mission we share. Thanks for making it a priority in your life.

Through the first three months of the year, our undesignated giving in support of Holy Trinity's ministry was \$109,178. Our budget expectation for that same period was \$110,638...a shortfall of 1.3%. Total income year to date was \$162,396, or about 95% of what we had hoped to achieve. Total expenditures were \$165,105. First quarter giving statements were mailed ... thank you for your attention to your own giving habits and for your generosity. If you have not made an estimate of giving for this year and would like to do so, please contact Rick Kimble, our financial secretary. Your tithes and offerings are the primary means by which we pay the day-to-day bills here...and by doing so, they extend God's love and grace through our mission work in this area and well beyond.



'Artists Among Us' Art Exhibition EXTENDED TO MAY 28







Do You Enjoy Baking?

Ingredients:

- 1½ cups whole wheat flour
- ½ cup regular white or bread flour
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 3 tablespoons butter (unsalted is best; may substitute margarine)
- 3/4 cup warm water
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 3/4 teaspoon salt

Directions:

Combine the first four ingredients well. Cut in the butter, and work in thoroughly.

- Combine the water and honey. Stir this into the flour/butter mixture, and combine until you have a sticky dough.
- Turn out onto a board/counter, adding flour until you can knead it. Knead until smooth.
- Divide the flour into four equal parts. Roll or press each part into a 6" flat circle.
- Lightly score a cross into the top of each circle. Brush with vegetable oil. Place onto a lightly-greased baking sheet.
- Bake at 350 for no more than 12 minutes. (Over baking makes the bread crumbly.)
- Remove and allow to cool completely.
- When cool it can be bagged for use later in the week or bagged and frozen for use up to three weeks later.
